

The first year of Rise:61

Having started with **little more than a vision**, a bedrock of relationships with young people and a **passionate belief in God's goodness**, it has been amazing to look back and see all that has been achieved this year. We have much for which to be thankful...

Meeting young people where they're at...

Through our weekly football matches in the compound and games of rounders and frisbee over the summer months we have built relationships with over 50 young people in Salisbury's Bemerton Heath community.

One young person who has been attending for years commented:

*"The activities helped me get out and meet new people, but the talking helped more. It made me realise how much damage was being done by the drugs and drinking. It motivated me to sort out my life; you pointed out the **potential of what we could be.**"*



This work expanded at the start of 2015 when we set up a small bike hub in a local garage thanks to a grant from Salisbury City Council. We have had ten young people coming each week, learning how to fix their own bikes and repairing donated bikes which are then sold.

Responding to needs...

Life is hard for many young people in this community and it has been our privilege to be asked by local schools and the council to mentor three lads. After supporting one young man to successfully return to school after 5 months of leave through 1:1 work and sporting activities a teacher commented to his mum *"What have you done to him? He is like a different child. He can't stop smiling."*



Seeing passions flourish

We have met so many young people with amazing skills and passions and it has been our privilege to give them opportunities for these to flourish. Through practical mentoring **we have supported:**

Nine young people to attend the Sound Emporium's School of Rock, where they have learnt to sing, write songs, play the guitar and enjoy making music. Three of these talented youngsters even made it to the final of a singing competition, where they faced their fears to deliver amazing performances to a packed out crowd at Salisbury Arts Centre.

Through practical mentoring we have also supported:

Two young entrepreneurs with advice and seed funding to set up micro businesses and sell their products at the teenage market.



One talented local freerunner to complete an accredited leadership qualification in the sport.

Supporting young people to change their world...

We are continuously reminded that when given the right opportunity young people can achieve amazing things. Through our practical mentoring we have empowered groups of young people to:

Organise a **football tournament** at Sarum Academy, a school where they had previously been excluded, giving the opportunity to return in a positive light and show what they are capable of.



Organise a fantastic **Christmas party** in the community with live music, a café, an inflatable obstacle course and more. A local resident commented:

"I had a lovely evening listening to all the young people singing. I took my two year old to see the Santa's Grotto. I think it's great that the children have somewhere to go and things to do".



Set up and run **Café Boost**, which has served delicious cakes, pancakes and hot drinks at locations across the city. After taking inspiration from a trip to visit Cafés in Bristol, the young people designed a logo, completed qualifications in food hygiene and honed their menu. Their hard work caught the attention of the Sound Emporium who are now looking to turn it in to a small scale business. In their words:

"I think it's good that we've been doing it since we were younger, about 14. It keeps you out of trouble, keeps you from getting cold outside, it's good to get your mind off things. At the end of the day gives you skills for the future."

Seeing faith soar...




Thank you...
